

# KASEMA



## Summary

Four communities unite to get water from the crater lake Barombi Mbo. This ancient crater lake is part of a nature reserve, though under pressure of both farming and urbanization. A 9 kilometres pipe transports the water from the lake to the first village. In the biggest village there is an office. Staff members of this water office collect user fees and manages the water system. The board of the water association oversees the office.

## Aims and results

- 21,000 people access to water
- 150 villagers trained in alternative income generating activities
- 1 management office with 4 staff members
- 1 care takers committee with 23 members
- 1 association with 18 board members

- Communities = Kake II, Small Ekombe, Marumba I and Marumba II, Kumba Subdivision, Meme Division, Southwest Region, Cameroon
- Inhabitants = 21,000 (estimated 2017)
- Yield water source = Crater Lake Barombi Mbo

- Expected duration = 6 years
- Budget = 237,805 Euro / 156,000,000 FCFA
