Summary

The Lobange community in Cameroon focuses on watershed protection and health improvement. A drinking water system provides 3,500 people. The community improves upon sanitation and hygiene, in order to prevent diseases like cholera. The water source is located in a wonderful natural setting where the community applies strict conservation measures. The community applies sustainable management of resources and alternative income generation, like collecting nuts and seeds, honey making and snail farming.

Aims and results

- 3,500 people access to water
- 20 acres of forest conserved
- I 20 farmers trained in organic farming
- 135 villagers trained in alternative income generating activities
- I management office with 2 staff members
- I care takers committee with 12 members
- I association with 13 board members

- Inhabitants = 3,500 (estimated 2017)
- Yield water source = 1,3 mio litres per day
- Start preparation project = 2014
