

BUEA TOWN



Summary

Seven communities concentrated around Buea Town do not have proper access to potable water. This is rather surprising as these communities are situated on the slope of Mount Cameroon, a 4,000 metres high volcano, with ample springs. To this day people queue for the little drinking water taps available or depend on buying water in jerry cans. Obviously this influences the hygienic conditions and economic position of the communities heavily. Humaniforest supports the communities to manage their own water system and to conserve their water sources.

Aims and results

- 15,500 people access to water
- 2 extensive ground water protection areas
- Renovation of 2 catchments and 5 stand taps
- Construction of 1 storage tank, 1 sedimentation tank and 5 stand taps
- 1 management office with 5 staff members
- 1 care takers committee with 12 members
- 1 association with elected board members
- 30,000 Euro yearly revenue to manage the water system and protection areas
- Sanitation facilities available on each compound



Project stats

- Communities = Mokunda, Wonyalyonga, Wondongo, Wonyeamongo, Moli, Vasingi and Ewonda, Southwest Region, Cameroon
- Inhabitants = 15,500 (estimated 2020)
- Yield water source = 1.2 mio litres per day
- Start preparation project = 2019
- Expected duration = 3 years
- Budget = 123,621 Euro / 81,095,376 CFA
- Investment = € 8 per community member
- Project manager = Eyole Lambe, CED
