

Annual Report 2024

Projects in Cameroon

In 2024, in partnership with LiveBuild, we continued to establish a community owned, business operated water system in 7 communities around Buea Town. This project is implemented by Humaniforest' founding partners in Cameroon, CED and FAHP. Humaniforest Netherlands, with LiveBuild, raises the required funds among others in partnership with EARTH Water, Wilde Ganzen and two private foundations. In 2024 we finished the construction work of the project and connected all communities to the pipeline network.

In 2024 most of our focus went to the Tiko Health Program. End of 2022 this Tiko Health Program was launched including access to clean water and prevention of malaria with an invention called 'EaveTubes'. EaveTubes is a product that is installed just under the roof in houses to prevent mosquitoes from transferring malaria parasites from one person to another. End of 2024 a major setback hit the implementation of EaveTubes. After many successful tests in several African countries, recent trials in Ivory Coast and Uganda gave less positive results than expected. Because of this EaveTubes will need further research and development, specifically of the powder that is used in West-African countries with high resistant mosquitoes. This development forced us to stop the Ethical Clearance procedure in Cameroon to obtain permission to import and use EaveTubes in the Tiko Health Program. Therefore the EaveTubes program has been suspended.

Together with Achmea Foundation we will continue with the water project in Likomba as part of the Tiko Health Program. In the future we will seek opportunities to support more communities in the Tiko region with water.

Finance

Our annual overhead expenses are as low as \in 170,- (mainly banking costs). We received \in 30,000.- of project contributions. We had \in 31,676.- in project expenses, of which \in 30,000.- directly went to project partners in Cameroon. Due to the setback with EaveTubes, our project reservations have diminished in 2023 and 2024. We invested quite a lot of our own means (in time and money) in the preparation of this project.

Forecast 2025

In 2025, the Likomba water project will continue within the Tiko Health Program. This project involves new construction and partial renovation of an outdated system. In the future we will seek opportunities to support more communities in the Tiko region with water.

We are also preparing a Cassava processing project, a social enterprise in which we generate work and income for vulnerable women (mostly young mothers).
